Dear Parents/Carers,

Please may I remind you we have a clear policy for uniform. Our children demonstrate a sense of pride in our school and this **MUST** be reflected in the wearing of our school uniform.

Hairstyles: Sensible hair styles please with no tram lines in the boy's hair or colours.

Jewellery: Only plain stud earrings with no attachment may be worn in an ear lobe. Children in the Foundation Stage are not permitted to wear earrings at any time. All earrings must be removed for P.E. activities in Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2. No other jewellery should be worn in school, with the exception of a watch. This must be removed for P.E. activities, staff are not permitted to remove or replace earrings under the Health and Safety Regulations, it is essential that all children wearing stud earrings are able to take them out and replace them themselves.

Girls: Winter - white shirt and tie, blue school logo V neck jumper/cardigan, grey knee length skirt, grey school tailored trousers, black sensible shoes and white knee length socks.

Girls: Summer – Pale blue gingham dress, blue school logo V neck jumper/cardigan, white socks.

Boys: Winter - white shirt and tie, blue school logo V neck jumper, grey trousers, black sensible shoes.

Boys: Summer – As winter except short grey trousers may be worn instead of trousers

May I remind you that following the uniform policy is also in line with our Code Of Conduct for Adults. Our Code Of Conduct for Adults clearly states 'Be a positive role-model for children, colleagues and parents'. Ignoring the school uniform policy is a breach of the Code Of Conduct for Adults, a copy has been attached for your information.

All uniform should be clearly marked with your child's name to prevent loss. I particularly ask that school uniform is school uniform and not an item of fashion wear. If your child is not currently wearing the correct uniform then this must be addressed **immediately**.
